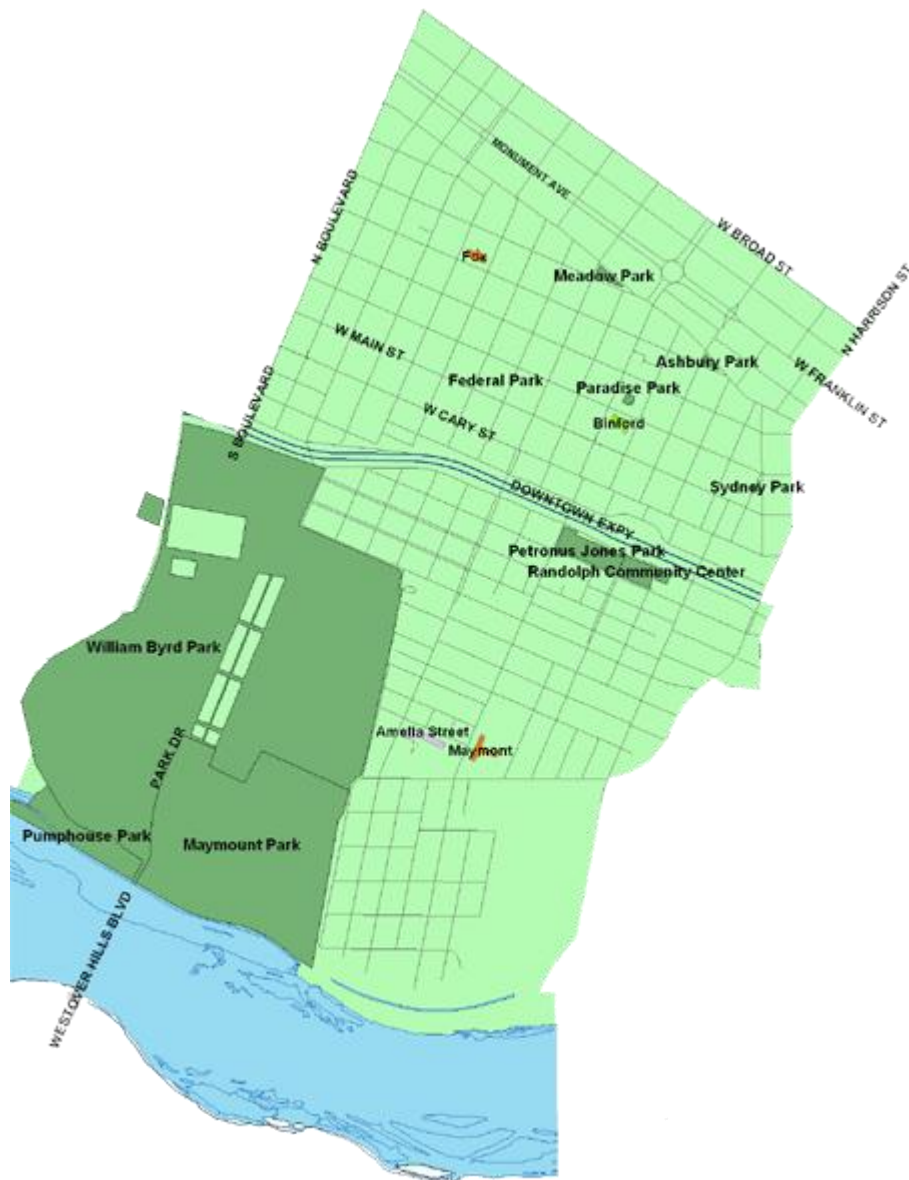


# Community Noteworthy Report

### Sector 313



**Sector 313:**

September 2011:

**Violent Crime: 50% decrease**

9/2011 vs. 9/2010 – five (5) crimes vs. ten (10) crimes.

**Property Crime: 49% increase**

9/2011 vs. 9/2010 – eighty-five (85) crimes vs. fifty-seven (57) crimes

**Major Crime: 34% increase**

9/2011 vs. 9/2010 – ninety (90) crimes vs. sixty-seven (67) crimes

**ROBBERY - INDIVIDUAL**

**50% decrease**

9/2011 vs. 9/2010 – one (1) robbery vs. two (2) robberies

**Trends/Patterns:**

The locations and suspect descriptions involving the one (1) robbery of an individual that occurred in September is listed below.

***Sunday, September 11, 2011, 7:00 PM***

***2300 W. Main Street***

The victims were walking in the alley when they were approached from behind by three suspects. The suspects grabbed the victims and began to cut and beat them while demanding their belongings. A fight between the victims and suspects continued until the suspects let the victims go and fled the scene in an unknown direction. The victims did not give the suspects any of their property and were fortunate to have avoided serious injury.

Armed w/ knife

B/M, 6'2", 20-30 YOA, 170-180 pounds, short black hair

Armed w/ blunt object

B/M, 6'2", 20-30 YOA, 170-180 pounds, short black hair

**Suspect #3:**

Armed w/ knife

B/M, 5'7", 20-30 YOA, 150-180 pounds, short black hair  
No further description was available.

*Sunday, September 4, 7:00 PM – Monday, September 5, 7:30 PM*

Unknown suspect entered the residence by throwing a brick through the side window and stole a lap top computer and two (2) speakers.

### **1100 block of W. Franklin Street – ARREST MADE**

Suspect entered the apartment through the unlocked window nearest the fire escape and stole jewelry and a digital camera. A witness called police who responded to the area and arrested the suspect.

**Habitually lock all doors and windows; including second-floor windows.**

**Keep all points-of-entry to your home well lit. Motion sensors on outdoor lights are an inexpensive deterrent and easy to install.**

**Use curtains or blinds to cover any windows or doors that are easy to see into.**

**Write down the descriptions of any suspicious vehicles and/or persons you see in your neighborhood and report that information to the police.**

**Join your neighborhood civic association and become an active member.**

## **SIGNIFICANT ARRESTS/ACTIVITY**

### **September 1**

Officer Michael Kiniry stopped a car for speeding in the 1900 block of W. Main Street. After speaking to the driver the officer observed what appeared to be a handgun hidden in the door frame. When back-up arrived the officer removed the driver from the car and retrieved the weapon. Subsequent investigation resulted in the driver being issued a ticket for speeding and a criminal summons for possession of a concealed weapon.

### **September 4**

Officer Chris Shore and Officer Ryan Bailey responded to the 2300 block of W. Broad Street in response to the attempted armed robbery of the Pizza Hut by three suspects. Upon arrival the officers spoke to the employees as well as several witnesses and were able to determine the path the suspects used in making their get away. The officers set up a perimeter and called for the assistance of K-9 units. Two K-9 units responded to the scene and tracked the suspect's path for several blocks before locating all three suspects hiding in a stairwell. As a result all three suspects were arrested and charged with attempted robbery.

### **September 5**

Officer Lucas Geiger, Officer Daniel Dixon and Officer Bernard Kenny responded to the 1100 block of W. Grace Street reference a call for an in-progress burglary at a multi-story apartment building. When Officer Geiger arrived he saw the suspect descending the fire escape stairs in the rear of the building. Officer Geiger waited until the suspect reached the ground before announcing his presence and ordering the suspect to the ground. When the suspect did not immediately comply Officer Geiger drew his taser and repeated his command for the suspect to surrender. The suspect complied as Officer Dixon and Officer Kenny arrived on scene and handcuffed the suspect. This burglary arrest was significant because there had been several other residential burglaries in the same area of the lower Fan (1100 blocks of W. Grace and W. Franklin Streets) where the point-of-entry was the rear window nearest the fire escape. After the arrest of this suspect there were no more burglaries reported involving burglaries with a similar point-of-entry and no more burglaries reported in the area of the lower Fan. In fact, after this arrest only one additional burglary was reported in the entire Fan neighborhood over rest of the month of September.

### **September 28**

Officer Anthony Paciello and Officer Stacy Rogers were on bike patrol when the SunTrust Bank in the 1800 block of W. Broad Street was robbed. The officers responded to the area and spotted a male matching the suspect's description near N. Lombardy and W. Broad Streets. The officers stopped the male and with the assistance of Detective William Cutshaw, were able to determine that the male was in fact the suspect who'd robbed the bank only minutes earlier.
