The Before and After School Program: Where Each Day Recreation is an Educational Experience!

Learning is fun in the Before and After School Program sponsored by Richmond's Department of Parks, Recreation & Community Facilities and Richmond Public Schools! Youth in Kindergarten through 5th Grade who attend participating schools are eligible to enroll at their school. When you register ask about all of the great activities planned for the year!

The After School Program is offered Monday through Friday at all participating sites during the school year from school dismissal until 5:30 pm. **At that time all children not riding the activity bus must be picked up by their parents.** The Before School Program is offered Monday through Friday from 7:45 to 8:30 am at Blackwell, Clark Springs and John B. Cary. **The After School program is only held on full-operating school days.** Each week the Before & After School Program will blend standard recreational activities such as arts and crafts, educational games, health, fitness and sports, performing arts and music with programs that focus on SOL subject areas, life skills and character building.



During the After School Program each student is expected to begin their homework and/or work on SOL subject areas every day except Friday.

- Program cost is \$50 per semester due in the Fall beginning on September 6, 2011 and in the Spring beginning on January 3, 2012. The \$100 fee for the year can be paid during fall registration. Payment plans are also available.
- Program t-shirt will be given to each student who registers for the program.
- Parents/guardians who are working or in school are encouraged to complete an application on-site for child care subsidy services as provided by the Richmond Department of Social Services.
- A copy of immunization and physical exam reports are due at registration.
- Families served by TANF should bring their number to registration.

All sites are licensed by Virginia Department of Social Services.

Each year, program youth participate in fundraising for an international service project that assists children and families in a sustainable way. During the 2011–2012 school year, students will raise funds to help provide free surgeries to repair cleft lip, cleft palate and other facial deformities for children around the globe through "Operation Smile." Students will also have the opportunity to make a difference closer to home through local community service.
